Project Title: Mason County Northshore Hood Canal Pollution Identification and Correction

Funding Source(s) and amount: \$250,000 DOE Centennial Clean Water Grant and MCPH match,
December 2009 – December 2011

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Summary of work to be performed: This is a continuation of the Hood Canal Pollution Identification and Correction Project along the Northshore of Hood Canal. MCPH will monitor freshwater discharges for fecal coliform and select sites for nutrients (NH₃-N, NO₂+NO₃-N and OP). MCPH will perform sanitary surveys and where needed dye tests to identify and correct the fecal pollution sources.
