

RESOLUTION No. 62-13

WHEREAS, on October 30, 1969, the County entered into an agreement with the Washington State Highway Department for the use of that portion of the Bourgault Road (CR #4196) lying west of SSR 101, the Skokomish Valley Road (CR #4164) from Mile 0.00 to Mile 0.68 and all of the Purdy Cutoff (CR #4178) as a detour for traffic on SSR 101 during the construction of a new bridge over Weaver Creek, Washington State Highway Department Contract # GC-2527, and

WHEREAS, the horizontal alignment, width and general condition of the Bourgault Road (CR #4196) and the Skokomish Valley Road (CR #4164) included in the detour route necessitate a reduced speed in the interest of safety.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that a speed limit of 35 miles per hour is hereby established for the Skokomish Valley Road (CR #4164) from Mile 0.00 to Mile 0.68 during the entire time these roads are used as a detour for SSR 101 traffic.

3. The central office, court room and records of the District Court for Mason County shall be held at the Mason County Court House in such space as may be provided by the Board of County Commissioners of Mason County.

4. The District Court of Mason County shall conduct hearings in any other areas in the county as shall be designated by the Justice as the volume of business may dictate. The designated place for all of such hearings shall be established by the Justice of said court.

5. There shall be no authority for any Justice Court Commissioners. However, the Justice may appoint one or more Justices of the Peace Pro Tempore who shall serve during the temporary absence, disqualification or incapacity of the Justice of the Peace of said district. The qualification of a Justice of the Peace Pro Tempore shall be the same as for a Justice of the District; provided a Justice of the Peace Pro Tempore shall be paid for each day he holds a session 1/250 of the annual salary of a full-time Justice of the District.

6. The District Court shall include The Municipal Department of the City of Shelton.

7. The Justice Court District shall be designated as The District Court of Mason County, State of Washington, and the Municipal Department shall be designated as the Municipal Department of the City of Shelton of the District Court of Mason County, State of Washington.

8. The Justice for the District Court of Mason County shall serve approximately three (3) hours per week in time devoted to the operation of the Municipal Department of the City of Shelton. For this time devoted to the operation of said Department, the Justice shall receive the sum of \$1,687.50.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the provisions of this Resolution are hereby declared necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, morals, peace and safety of the people of Mason County and that an emergency is hereby declared to exist and the provisions of this Resolution shall go into full force and effect immediately without any other or further hearing hereon.
