

RESOLUTION NO. 176

WHEREAS, there is a 100% Federal Grant available through the State of Washington Planning & Community Affairs Agency - Law & Justice Planning Office division - for minority hiring and training of Indian Deputies for the Sheriff's Departments; and

WHEREAS, the Mason County Sheriff has expressed a desire to participate in the Federally financed program for one year in the hiring and training of four (4) Indian Deputies, two (2) to be assigned to the Squaxin Indian Reservation, and two (2) to be assigned to the Skokomish Indian Reservation; and

WHEREAS, said federal funds would include complete equipment, two (2) police cars and one patrol boat for a twelve month period for said trainees, said funds to be paid the County in a lump sum for the twelve month period upon Federal approval of the proper application thereunder.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it hereby resolved by the Board of County Commissioners, that the Mason County Sheriff be granted the authority to submit an application for funds to cover the program for the four (4) deputies for a twelve month period.
