

## RESOLUTION NO. 183

WHEREAS, on August 25, 1971, the County Auditor received a Petition signed by 320 qualified registered voters residing within portions of Capitol Hill, Miller, Northside and Pickering Precincts, Petitioning to be annexed to Mason County Fire Protection District No. 5 (Allyn); and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners of said Fire Protection District did submit a Resolution to the Board of County Commissioners dated August 23, 1971, requesting them to annex the area (described more fully on the attached Petition) to Fire Protection District No. 5; and

WHEREAS, the County Auditor did make the necessary examination of the Registration records in the precincts in which the territory is involved, as required by RCW 52.08.060, and on September 8, 1971, did Certify the sufficiency of said Petition as representing more than 60% of the registered voters in the area; and

WHEREAS, according to said Statute, in event that 60% of the qualified registered electors residing within the territory proposed to be annexed, sign the Petition, and the Fire District Commissioners concur therein, an election in such territory, and a hearing on such Petition, shall be dispensed with, and the Board of County Commissioners shall enter an Order incorporating such territory into said existing Fire Protection District; and

WHEREAS, there is at present an outstanding obligation against the existing Fire Protection District, of which the signers of the Petition for Annexation have been advised, it is hereby agreed and understood that the annexed area residents will assume their proportionate share of the outstanding bonded indebtedness of Fire Protection District No. 5, in exchange for fire protection.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the attached described area, which has never been included within a Fire Protection District, and which lies adjacent thereto, IS HEREBY ANNEXED to Mason County Fire Protection District No. 5 (Allyn), and that the County Assessor be instructed to include the annexed area within the taxable limits of said Fire Protection District at the earliest possible date.

14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25,  
Township 20 North, Range 3 West; EXCEPTING such portions  
thereof lying Easterly of Pickering Passage, lying  
Southerly of Hammersley Inlet, lying within the  
limits of the City of Shelton, and/or lying within the  
boundaries of other Fire Protection Districts. Mason  
County, Washington.
