

RESOLUTION NO. 259

WHEREAS, the speed limits on County roads in Mason County, Washington, were fixed by Resolution adopted on January 9, 1956 as 35 miles per hour, except certain roads as otherwise posted; and

WHEREAS, on November 5, 1962 said Resolution was amended to fix the maximum speed limit of 45 miles per hour on all County roads, unless otherwise posted; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the Board of County Commissioners to be the recommendation of the County Engineer that the conditions prevalent on certain short roads in the Union area justify a speed limit of 25 miles per hour.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED AND ORDERED that certain short roads in the Union area be posted at 25 miles per hour effective immediately. The roads affected by this order are as follows: Main Street, Alder Street, Seattle Street, 3rd Street, 4th Street, Wondervue Drive, Orre Nobles Road, Mason Street and McReavy Road from SR 106 to a point 200 feet east of the intersection of 4th Street.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED that the speed limit on the following roads in the Union area be posted at 35 miles per hour effective immediately: McReavy Road from a point 200 feet east of the intersection of 4th Street to the intersection of Manzanita Drive, and 5th Street from the intersection of Seattle Street to the intersection of McReavy Road. The County Engineer is directed to erect the necessary 25 miles per hour and 35 miles per hour signs on said roads in conformity herewith.
