

RESOLUTION NO. 270

MONUMENT RECOVERY

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the Board of County Commissioners that the recovery of survey monuments within the limits of county road rights-of-way, by public and private agencies, in some instances create damages to road surfaces and is a hazard to the public health and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the recovery and perpetuation of said survey monuments is of vital interest to both public and private agencies and persons.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that those persons who are engaged in the recovery of said monuments restore the road surfaces in a manner prescribed by the Mason County Engineer; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mason County Road Department will furnish on request the necessary monuments and monument cases, for the perpetuation of said monuments, and the necessary patching materials for the restoration of the county roads that are damaged by either the search or recovery of said monuments.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that persons engaged in the recovery of said monuments provide the Mason County Engineer's Department with suitable survey references within sixty days after the completion of monumentation.
